EA Update

Members are advised that Fair Work Australia has amended the ballot date for the RTBU ballot to close no later than January 18th due to the Australian Electoral Commission's commitments over the Christmas break. The AEC have now supplied us with the following amended timetable:

Date	Process
18.12.12	Ballot opens – AEC posts ballot
	material to eligible voters by 5:00
	pm.
19 th December to 21 st December	Ballot material in transit
24 th December to 9 th January	Eligible voters consider ballot material
10 th January	Return of Ballot Material – In Transit
11 th January	Ballot Closes at 10am. Result declared as soon as practicable.

As reported in the last newsflash PN NSW Coal last week sought conciliation with Fair Work Australia on the disputed policy matters. The parties met last week and again yesterday. The RTBU were unable to accept Pacific Nationals position as the only substantive change in their position was to offer an additional \$200 to the incentive payment.

You would now be aware that PN's EA vote opened this morning. We cannot stress enough the importance of voting in this ballot and voting \mathbf{NO}_{\bullet}
