## Aurizon in-cab recordings: your view

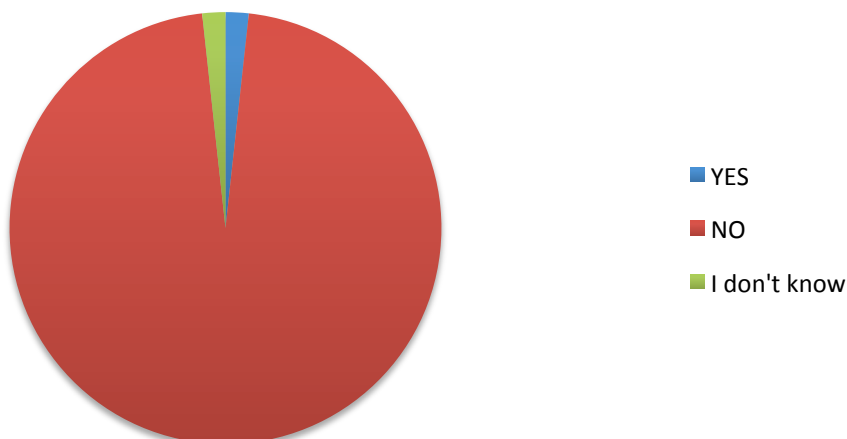

### Do you support Aurizon's implementation of the in-cab recording systems?



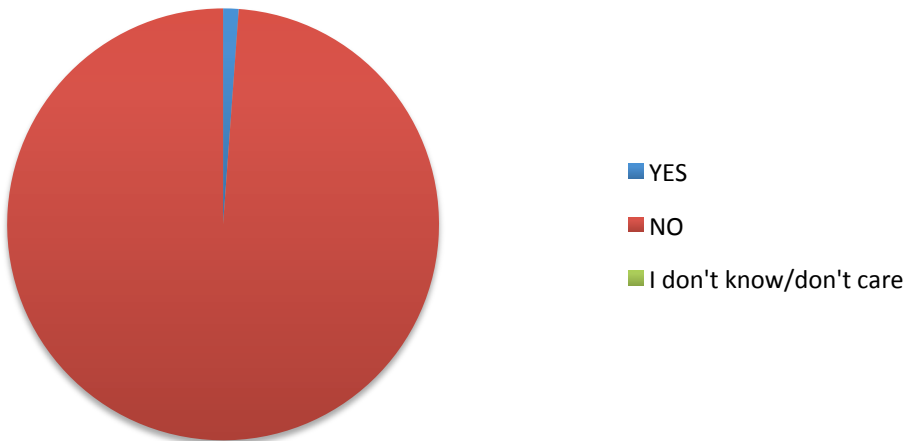

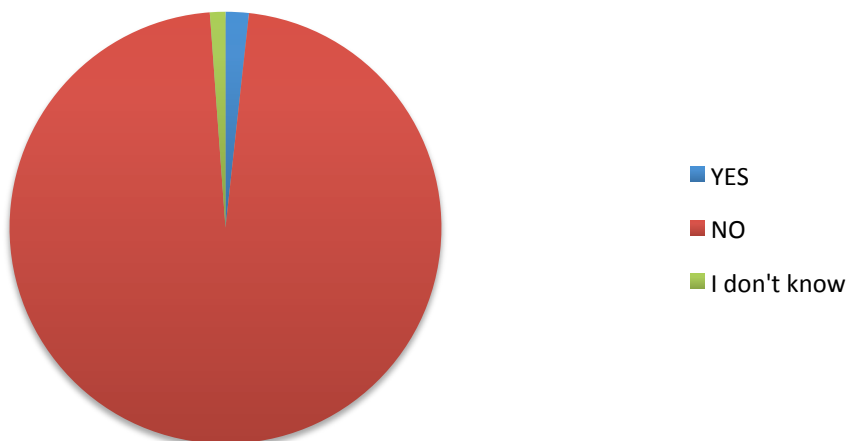

**Do you believe the in-cab recording system will reduce incidents?**



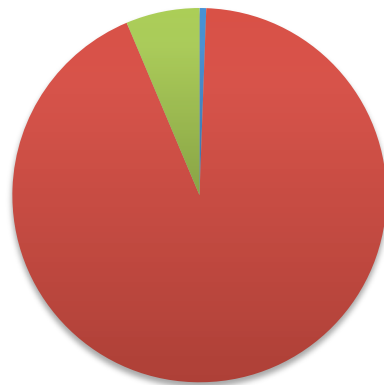

**Do you feel Aurizon has undertaken a comprehensive consultation process with workers on the Block 1B upgrade?**



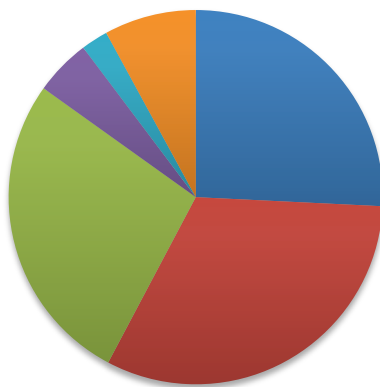
