The Trans-Pacific Partnership was a trade deal originally involving Australia, US and 10 other Pacific Rim countries (TPP-12). It reduced our democratic rights while increasing the rights of global corporations. After 6 years of community campaigning, the withdrawal of the US in 2017 killed off the original TPP-12.

A rebranded TPP-11 without the US has emerged but it is still a bad deal. Some clauses have been suspended, but could be reinstated if the US re-joins the deal. The TPP-11 still increases corporate rights at the expense of people's rights. It still includes:

- special rights for foreign investors to bypass national courts and sue governments in unfair international tribunals over health, environmental and industrial laws
- restrictions on government regulation of essential services, and facilitates privatisation
- more vulnerable temporary workers without first testing if local workers are available.

Change the Rules on Trade: campaign for the Senate to reject the TPP-11

The TPP-11 has been tabled in Parliament and is being reviewed by a joint committee dominated by the government before consideration of the implementing legislation. We have succeeded in getting a Senate Inquiry on which the government does not have a majority and are campaigning for the Senate to reject the TPP-11 implementing legislation.

The government-dominated joint committee is meeting at 1 Bligh St, Sydney, on June 15.
